

Lets Cook! Frozen barana bites

Peel and cut 3 to 4 large bananas into thick slices. Add a dab of nut butter (or sunflower seed butter and any other spread you want) to the center to create a banana nut butter sandwich. Then, place them on a parchment lined baking sheet. Once you've finished assembling your banana sandwiches, place the baking sheet in the freezer for 1 to 2 hours, until the banana sandwiches are frozen solid. Then time to enjoy!
